We are 'School Bus Safe' @ KGV We put safety first:

We are safe while boarding, riding, and exiting the bus.

We stay seated with seat belts on and keep aisles clear.

We get on the bus in the appropriate place at the appropriate time

We follow instructions:

We listen to the bus driver and supervisors, following their instructions at all times.

We are mindful of personal space:

We respect each other's personal space and avoid any physical altercations or pushing.

It is not your seat!



We have respect for others:

We put our bags on our lap or the floor, not on the seats

We encourage respectful behavior towards fellow students and the bus driver by greeting each other and the driver

We use kind words, avoiding disruptive behavior, and keep our noise levels down.

We use indoor voices to avoid distracting the driver.



We keep the Bus Clean:

We refrain from Eating or Drinking

We keep the bus clean as it is everyone's responsibility.

We don't throw objects inside or outside the bus

We take our belongings with us

Report Issues:

We are upstanders if we see or experience bullying or unsafe behaviour.

We report these issues to an adult such as our tutor or our parents.



Technology and Bus Safety

- \star Stay alert to your surroundings
- \star Keep phones on silent to avoid distracting the driver
- \star Never take photos or videos of others without permission
- \star Use devices responsibly and follow school policies
- \star Remember: your safety is more important than your devices



Emergency Preparedness



- \star Know the location of emergency exits
- \star In an emergency, stay calm, sit still and follow driver instructions. They are trained.
- \star Help younger students if it's safe to do so
- \star If it's safe to leave the bus, go to a safe place as instructed.
- \star Stay with the group.
